The Lesedi Local Municipality hereby invites bids for the Appointment of electrical contractors for the electrification of residential units in Lesedi Local Municipality on an as and when required basis from date of award for a period of 3 years.

Tender documents, together with the terms of reference, which are important for the preparation of the tender are accessible for free on the E-Tender portal ([www.etenders.gov.za](http://www.etenders.gov.za)) as from 20 September 2019. The Compulsory briefing session will be held on 26 September 2019, 11h00 at the Infrastructure Services Boardroom.

The completed bids must be submitted in a sealed envelope marked: **“TENDER NO: 43/2019: THE APPOINTMENT OF ELECTRICAL CONTRACTORS FOR THE ELECTRIFICATION OF RESIDENTIAL UNITS IN LESEDI LOCAL MUNICIPALITY ON AN AS AND WHEN REQUIRED BASIS FROM DATE OF AWARD FOR A PERIOD OF 3 YEARS**

Bids must be placed in the tender box situated at the Supply Chain Management Department, Municipal Building, c/o H.F Verwoerd and Du Preez Street, Heidelberg, during office hours Monday – Friday, 07:30 – 16:00. The tender closes on the 22 October 2019 at 12:00. No late, or e-mailed or faxed bids will be considered. All objections and complaints must be lodged within 14 days and in writing to the municipal manager's office.

Bidders must note that this bid may be awarded to more than one bidder. Bidders must note that certain works under this Bid may only be constructed using labour-based construction methods and must limit the utilization of their permanently employed personnel to Key Personnel and all other personnel and labourers must be recruited locally.

Bidders must be registered with the Construction Industry Development Board (CIDB) in a contractor grading designation determined in accordance with the sum tendered for a 7 EP class of construction work.

Bidders must note that only electrical cables that are 90%, Transformers that are 10 – 100% and Power line Hardware and Structures that are 100% locally produced or locally manufactured and from local raw material or input will be considered.

In terms of section 5 of the Preferential Procurement Policy Framework Act, 2000 (Act No. 5 of 2000), Preferential Procurement Regulations, 2017, The successful tenderer must subcontract in compliance with section 5 (clause 9) of the Preferential Policy Framework Act, 2000 (Act No. 5 of 2000) a minimum of 30% of the contract value to an EME or QSE which is at least 51% owned by black people;

Bidder's attention is specifically drawn to the provisions of the rules which are included in the bid documents. The Lesedi Local Municipality (LLM) reserves the right not to award to the lowest priced proposal, it normally awards the contract to the tenderer who proves to be fully capable of handling the contract and whose proposal is technically acceptable, has meaningful empowerment credentials and/or is financially advantageous to the LLM. Bids completed in pencil will be regarded as invalid bids.

Only bidders who score 70% or more for functionality will be further evaluated on both Price and B-BBEE points.

The 80/20 preference procurement point system will apply and preference will be given to bidders who are able to demonstrate the following:

All service providers must submit their B-BBEE Verification Certificate from Verification Agencies accredited by the South African Accreditation Systems (SANAS) or a Registered Auditor approved by the Independent Regulatory Board (IRBA) or an Accounting Officer as contemplated in the Close Corporation Act (CCA) in order to claim preference points.

It is compulsory that the taxes of the successful bidder must be in order or that satisfactory arrangements have been made with South African Revenue Service (SARS) to meet the bidder's tax obligations. Additionally, no contract shall be concluded with any bidder, whose municipal rates and taxes and service charges are in arrears for more than three months. All bidders must ensure that they are registered on the National Treasury Central Supplier Database via the following link:[business.support@csd.gov.za](mailto:business.support@csd.gov.za). No business will be conducted with any person who is not registered on this database.
